Donated or Skipped Boats

Sailing Yachts: Keel sailboats with berths for 4-5 scouts with separate berth for adult owner are highly desirable. Larger sailboats with accommodations for 8-10 persons are useful too.

Racing Sailboats: Optimist, Laser, 420, FJ, Snark, etc. with and without trailers. Extra sails, rigging, hardware, etc. also needed.

Other Vessels: Dinghies, rowboats, canoes, kayaks, and Jon boats are useful to the boating program.

Boating and Support Equipment

Emergency Signaling Devices, Binoculars, VHF Radios, Life Preservers, Anchors, Rope and Line, Navigation Tools, Boat Repair Equipment, Outboard Motors, Sewing Machines, Porta-Potties, Camping Gear (like stoves, cook gear, and tents), etc.

Waterfront Services

Boat Slips: Seaward Bound has an immediate need for a FREE boat slip in the vicinity of Hampton that has at least 6ft water depth (MLLW), 30ft length, nearby water and electricity, and bathroom facility.

Boat and Motor Repair: Anyone with skills related to boat and marine motor maintenance and repair would be welcome to help. In addition to assistance at the waterfront, skilled persons could spread interest and understanding of their craft to the kids through short instruction periods.

Storage Sheds: Seaward Bound needs a secure storage shed that can be relocated at our chartered partner's location. The size preferred is at least 100 square feet.
